FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS

1. What is the academic eligibility to apply for Three year Unitary LL.B Entrance Examination conducted by Commissioner for Entrance Examinations Kerala?

Candidate seeking admission to the course should be a graduate in any faculty of any University in Kerala or of any other Universities, recognized by any of the Universities in Kerala as equivalent thereto.

A candidate who has passed the Bachelor's Degree examination with a minimum of 45% marks in aggregate (i.e., 45% marks for all the parts of the Degree Examination taken together) shall alone be eligible for admission to the 3 year Unitary LL.B course. However, candidates belonging to Socially and educationally Backward Classes need only 42% marks and those belonging to the Scheduled castes/Scheduled Tribes need only 40% marks in the qualifying examination. No rounding off of percentage of marks to the nearest higher integer is permitted. Applicants who have obtained first degree certificate after prosecuting studies in distance or correspondence method shall also be considered as eligible for admission. The applicants who have obtained graduation/post-graduation through open universities system directly without having any basic qualification for prosecuting such studies are not eligible for admission.

Candidates who are appearing /appeared for the qualifying examination (regular examination of 2025 academic years) are also eligible to apply for the Entrance Examination. Such candidates become eligible for **admission** only if they produce the Provisional / Degree certificate of the qualifying examination and the mark lists of all parts of the qualifying examination at the time of admission.

2. Is there any age limit for admission to Three Year LL.B Course 2025?

There is no lower age limit for admission to the 3 year LL.B course. The upper age limit for admission to the Three year LLB Course will be subject to the decision of the Hon'ble Supreme Court of India. In case if age restriction under clause 28 of Legal Education Rules, 2008 of Bar Council of India is reinstated, only those candidates within the stipulated age limit will be allowed to appear for the Entrance Examination.

3. I am a candidate belonging to SEBC community. What documents should I upload with the application for claiming community reservation?

You are required to upload Non Creamy Layer certificate obtained from the Village Officer/Tahsildar in the prescribed format, which you can download from the website of the Commissioner for Entrance Examinations. The above certificate in original should be produced before the college authority at the time of admission.

4. What documents should a candidate belonging to SC/ST community submit for claiming community reservation? Is there any upper income limit for being eligible for communal reservation?

A candidate belonging to SC/ST community should upload community certificate obtained from the Tahsildar. There is no limit on annual income for SC/ST category for claiming communal reservation. Hence, they need not submit income certificate.

5. I am a child of an inter-caste married couple. My father belongs to forward community and my mother belongs to SEBC category. Am I eligible for claiming SEBC reservation? If so, what should I do to claim the benefit?

You are required to upload Non Creamy Layer certificate obtained from the Village Officer/Tahasildar in the prescribed format, which you can download from the website of the Commissioner for Entrance Examinations. The above certificate in original should be produced at the time of admission.

6. I am a child of an inter-caste married couple. My father belongs to forward community and my mother belongs to SC/ST category. Am I eligible for claiming SC/ST reservation? If so, what should I do to claim the benefit?

Yes, you are eligible for claiming reservation under SC/ST category. For this, you have to upload inter-caste marriage certificate and Community Certificate showing that you are SC/ST. Both the certificates should be obtained from the Tahsildar in the prescribed format that you can download from the website of the Commissioner for Entrance Examinations website. The certificates in original should be produced at the time of admission.

7. I am an ex-serviceman keen to pursue law studies. Can I apply for exserviceman quota in Three Year LL.B Course?

Yes. Ex-serviceman quota in Three Year LL.B Course is applicable to ex-servicemen/ children of ex-servicemen. See clause 14(i) of the prospectus.

8. I intend to apply for Three Year LL.B Course in sports quota. What should I do?

You have to apply online to the Commissioner for Entrance Examinations as per the instructions in clause 14(iii) of the prospectus for the year 2025. Further, you have to forward the printout of the application acknowledgement page with relevant documents to The Secretary, Kerala State Sports Council, Thiruvananthapuram-695001, before the last date of submission of application.

9. Is there special reservation for NCC for 3 Year LL.B Course?

Yes. [See clause 14(vi) of the prospectus]

10. I am SC converted to Christianity. Am I eligible for SC seat reservation?

No. However, you are eligible for reservation under Backward Christian and OEC categories.

11.1 am a candidate belonging to Dheevara community, but my annual family income exceeds Rs. 6.00 lakhs. If I gain admission in general merit, am I eligible for fee concession?

You are required to upload Non Creamy Layer certificate (for State Educational Purpose) obtained from the Village Officer in the prescribed format and produce it in original at the time of admission. You are eligible for fee concession as applicable to OEC candidates.

12.1 am a candidate belonging to SC community, but my annual family income exceeds Rs. 6.00 lakhs. Am I eligible for SC reservation?

Yes. There is no income limit for SC/ST reservation

13. Should I be a native of Kerala to be eligible to apply for Three Year LL.B Course?

No. Any Indian citizen fulfilling the eligibility conditions laid down in Clause 9 of the prospectus for the year 2025 can apply.

14. What are the points to be taken care of regarding online uploading of photo?

The candidate has to upload his/her latest passport size colour photograph (studio taken) with light background, in jpg format. The size should not be more than 100 kb and dimensions 150 pixels (width) X 200 pixels (height).

The photograph should be clear and should not be taken with the candidate wearing cap or goggles. Spectacles are allowed, if being used regularly. Polaroid and computer/mobile phone generated photos are not acceptable. Non-compliance of these instructions may lead to rejection of application.

15. I had qualified in the Three Year LL.B entrance examination held in 2024, but did not get admission. Will I be considered for 2025 allotment?

No. You have to write the Entrance Examination for the academic year 2025 and qualify in it for being considered for allotment in the year 2025.
