## 1 INTRODUCTION

- 1.1 Prospectus for Admission to the Post Graduate course in Pharmacy (M.Pharm) in the academic year 2026-2027 that has been approved by the Government of Kerala is published herewith. It contains general information and rules relating to the admission for academic year 2026-2027, and other related information. Candidates are required to go through the Prospectus carefully and acquaint themselves with all the relevant information. Candidates are also requested to visit the official website of the Commissioner for Entrance Examinations (CEE), Government of Kerala viz. [www.cee.kerala.gov.in](http://www.cee.kerala.gov.in) regularly for notifications, updates and announcements connected with admissions. The Prospectus is as per the Pharmacy Council of India Regulations No.14-136/2014.PCI dt 10/12/2014.
- 1.2 The Prospectus issued in earlier years for this course is not valid for the year 2026. This Prospectus sets out the rules and regulations for selection and admission to the following Post Graduate course conducted by various institutions within the State of Kerala.

## 2 INSTITUTIONS and COURSES

### 2.1 Master of Pharmacy (M.PHARM)

M.Pharm course is conducted by the following Government and self financing institutions. The number of seats with specialization in self financing colleges shall be published before the allotment process.

## 2.1 Admission/Allotment

Admission/allotment of students to all M.Pharm seats in Government Colleges shall be based on criteria and conditions detailed in this prospectus and fee structure for admissions in 2026-27 academic year.

Fifty percent of total seats for M.Pharm course in self financing colleges are set apart for admissions under Government merit quota and the remaining fifty percent seats under Management quota. Admission/allotment of students under Government merit seats in self financing colleges shall be based on criteria and conditions detailed in this prospectus, terms and conditions in the agreement that would be executed between the Managements and Government regarding admissions and fee structure for admissions in 2026-27 academic year and Government order(s) regarding allotment.

- 2.2 Admission for M.Pharm 2026 may be conducted on the basis of **three online counseling allotments**. Vacancies that may exist/arise in various Pharmacy Colleges after the third phase allotment process will be filled up through stray vacancy allotment to be conducted by the Commissioner for Entrance Examinations.

## 3 ELIGIBILITY FOR ADMISSION

### 3.1 Nativity

Only Indian citizens of Kerala origin are eligible for admission to the courses covered in this prospectus. To prove nativity, the candidate has to upload any one of the following certificate to the application:

- a. The relevant page of Secondary School Leaving Certificate of the candidate showing the place of birth in Kerala.
- b. The relevant page of Secondary School Leaving Certificate showing place of birth in Kerala either of the parents of the candidate with corroborative certificate to establish the relationship between the parent and the candidate.
- c. The relevant page of the Passport of the candidate, issued by the Government of India showing the place of birth in Kerala or of either of the parents of the candidate showing the place of birth in Kerala along with

corroborative certificate to establish the relationship between the parent and the candidate.

- d. A Certificate of Birth issued by an authority competent to register birth (Panchayat, Municipality, Corporation) of the candidate or of either of the parents of the candidate along with corroborative certificate to establish the relationship between the parent and the candidate, showing the place of birth in Kerala.
- e. A Certificate issued by the Village Officer/Tahsildar in prescribed format (**Annexure III**) showing that the candidate or his/her father/mother was born in Kerala.

### 3.2 Academic Eligibility

- 3.2.1 M.Pharm: The candidates who have passed the B.Pharm Degree examination from any of the Universities in Kerala or from any other Universities recognized by the Kerala University of Health Sciences, Thrissur as equivalent thereto from an institution recognized by the All India Council of Technical Education, New Delhi and Pharmacy Council of India, with a minimum of 55% marks for all the Three years of B.Pharm Examination (B.Pharm II, III, IV year) taken together, will be eligible for admission. For service candidates seeking admission against the reserved quota, the minimum marks required shall also be 55%. Candidates who have passed their B.Pharm course from Universities outside Kerala will be eligible for admission only if their qualifying examination is recognized by the Kerala University of Health Sciences before the last date specified for submission of academic data. For candidates having not less than 5 years professional experience, after passing B.Pharm course, there shall be relaxation in pass percentage from 55% to 50% for admission to M.Pharm Course.
- 3.2.2. For candidates belonging to SC/ST communities a **minimum of 50% marks** for all the Three years of B.Pharm Examination (B.Pharm II, III, IV year) taken together will be eligible for admission.
- 3.2.3. All applications claiming Service Quota shall be forwarded through the Heads of concerned Departments (DME/DHS/ DRUGS CONTROLLER).
- 3.2.4 **Every student, selected for admission to postgraduate pharmacy course in any of the pharmacy institution in the country should have obtained registration with the State Pharmacy Council or should obtain the same within one month from the date of his admission, failing which the admission of the candidates shall be cancelled.**

### 3.3 Age

There is no upper age limit for General Quota candidates.

For Service candidates - refer clause 8.1

All applicants should satisfy the requirements for admission as specified in Clause 3.2 before the last date fixed for submission of academic data.

## 4 DURATION

### 4.1 M.Pharm

The program of study for M.Pharm shall extend over a period of four semesters, full time (two academic years). Each semester shall consist of not less than 100 working days.

## 5 SELECTION

- 5.1.1 The candidates including service quota candidates who qualified GRADUATEPHARMACY APTITUDE TEST (GPAT) in the year 2024,2025 & 2026 conducted by National Board of Examinations in Medical sciences (NBEMS), New

Delhi are eligible for applying for Admission to the Post Graduate course in Pharmacy (M.Pharm) in the academic year 2026-2027.

- 5.1.2. The applicants under Service Quota should have completed Probation under regular appointment in the concerned Department to become eligible to apply.

## 6 CENTRALISED ALLOTMENT(SWS)

The allotment to respective colleges/courses/branches is through a Single Window Centralized Allotment Process based on the options filed by the candidate online. The Commissioner for Entrance Examinations (CEE), Kerala will prepare the rank list and conduct the online allotment process.

## 7 RESERVATION OF SEATS

### 7.1 M.Pharm

#### 7.1.1 Service Quota

One seat is reserved in College of Pharmaceutical Sciences, Government Medical College, Thiruvananthapuram for B.Pharm Degree holders in the Drugs Control department. In the absence of qualified hands from the Drugs Control department, this seat will be filled among the staff (Technicians and Pharmacists on rotation basis) of Directorate of Medical Education and Directorate of Health Services on rotation basis. In the absence of qualified persons from Medical Education Services and Health Services Department, the seat will be filled by B.Pharm holders from Employees State Insurance Department. **For the academic year 2026, this seat is reserved in the subject Pharmacy Practice.**

#### 7.1.2 Community Reservation

Community reservation (distributed equally among all the subjects) is as follows:-

#### 7.1.3 Reservation for Physically Disabled (PD)- (See the annexure-XX)

The eligibility criteria are as follows:

Five percent of the seats available to the state for allotment from the State rank lists are reserved for candidates with benchmark disabilities for all courses in Govt. /Self financing Colleges as stipulated in Section 32, Chapter VI of the Persons with Disabilities Act 2016. As per Clause 2 (r), Chapter I of the Act, 'Person with benchmark disability' means a person with not less than 40% of a specified disability where specified disability has not been defined in measurable terms and includes a person with disability where specified disability has been defined in measurable terms, as certified by the certifying authority. Generally, candidates who have a minimum of 40% disability alone will be eligible to apply for this quota.

Candidates claiming PD status should indicate the same on the online application and upload valid UDID card/Disability certificate issued by a competent authority.

The State Medical Board under the chairmanship of the Director of Medical Education consisting of Medical experts in General Medicine, ENT, Neurology, Orthopaedic surgery, Ophthalmology, Psychiatry, Clinical Psychologist and Physical Medicine & Rehabilitation **and special invitee in the Pharmacy course** will take a final decision on the suitability of the candidate to study a particular course applied by him/her, as per the criteria fixed by the Central Councils/Universities/Government Orders.

The recommendations of this State Level committee will be binding on the candidates. The selection of candidates under this category will be based on the merit in the Entrance Examination and physical suitability, and not on the basis of the degree of disability.

The Commissioner for Entrance Examinations will prepare and publish the list of candidates eligible under PwD quota based on the recommendations of the State Level Committee.

“In case no qualified candidates are available under PwD Category, the seats will go to General Merit.” Seats will be earmarked for the PwD Category as per the order of subjects shown in seat Distribution list published later.

## **7.2 Un-availed Reserved seats**

If there are no candidates in the rank list of reserved category (7.1.1, 7.1.2 or 7.1.3) the same will be filled up by eligible candidates included in the Rank list of General Merit candidates.

## **7.3 Reservation of Seats for Economically Weaker Sections in general category:** As per the G.O. (P)No.1/2020/P&ARD dated. 03.01.2020, G.O. (Ms) No.128 /2020/H.Edn dated. 20.03.2020, Government has decided to implement 10% reservation for Economically Weaker Sections in General Category (EWS) to all Higher Educational Institutions other than minority Institutions, where the reservations to other backward classes are provided.

# **8. CRITERIA FOR SELECTION UNDER RESERVED CATEGORY**

## **8.1 Service Quota**

8.1.1 The candidate selected should have at least five years of service for superannuation after completion of the course. The selection under the service quota will be based on the qualified rank of the candidate as mentioned in clause 5.1.1. All applications claiming service quota shall be forwarded through the Heads of concerned Department (DME/DHS/DIMS/Drugs Controller).

8.1.2 The candidates admitted under service quota will have to serve the Government continuously for a period of not less than five years immediately after the completion of the course and shall not be permitted to avail Leave without Allowance during that period for taking up employment elsewhere. In the event of any violation of these conditions, he/she will have to pay Rs.5, 00,000/- (Rupees Five Lakh Only) and stipend. **Service candidates will have to execute a bond at the time of admission in this respect as given in Annexure IV.**

8.1.3 Service candidates who are selected for M.Pharm course under Service reservation quota who fail to join the course/discontinue the course after joining, other than on medical grounds will not be eligible for applying to the course under Service reservation quota for three consecutive years after the year of selection.

## **8.2 Scheduled Caste and Scheduled Tribes Quota**

The candidates who apply under this category should produce the Certificate from the Tahsildar of the Taluk concerned, that he/she belongs to Scheduled Caste/Scheduled Tribes (Ref : Annexure V and VI).

## 8.2.1 Claim for Reservation under Scheduled Castes/Scheduled Tribes Quota

- 8.2.1(a) Candidates claiming reservation under Scheduled Castes/Scheduled Tribes quota should obtain the Caste/Community Certificate from a Revenue Officer not below the rank of a Tahsildar, in the prescribed format (**Annexure VII**). The following certificate should also be got recorded by the Revenue Official below the said certificates: “The Certificate is issued after observing the guidelines issued in Government Circular No. 18421/E2/SCSTDD dated 15-12-1987”.
- 8.2.1(b) The applications for the reserved seats of Scheduled Castes/ Scheduled Tribes candidates which do not contain Scheduled Castes/Scheduled Tribes Certificates (Community Certificate) from the Tahsildar in the prescribed format will not be considered on any account against the seats reserved for Scheduled Castes/Scheduled Tribes candidates (vide G.O. (MS)No.31/90/SCSTDD dated 25-05-1990). The community certificate should clearly specify that the candidate himself/herself (not the father or mother) belongs to the Scheduled Castes/Scheduled Tribes. The Community Certificates obtained earlier for other purposes will not be accepted. The candidates who are reconverted to Hinduism from Christianity of Scheduled Caste origin should produce community certificate from the Tahsildar concerned along with a copy of Gazette Notification regarding re-conversion.
- 8.2.1(c) The claim for reservation under Schedule Caste/Schedule Tribes quota will also be subjected to verification and clearance by the Screening Committee constituted for the purpose by Government vide G.O. (MS) No.23/89/SCSTDD dated 22-05-1989 and as authorized by Section 6 of the Kerala (Scheduled Castes and Scheduled Tribes) Regulation of issue of Community Certificates Act - 1996 (Act 11 of 1996).
- 8.2.1(d) The Scheduled Castes/Scheduled Tribes claims in respect of those who have migrated from one State to another will be subjected to the provisions of GO (MS) No. 10/86/SCSTDD dated 12-02-1986. Only the children of those who had migrated to this State before the promulgation of the Constitution (Scheduled Castes) Order 1950 and the Constitution (Scheduled Tribes) Order 1950, and who ordinarily reside in this State can claim Scheduled Castes/ Scheduled Tribes benefits from the State of Kerala. They must be able to prove this, if required.
- 8.2.1(e) Children of inter-caste marriage who claim reservation under Scheduled Castes/Scheduled Tribes quota should produce necessary certificates to this effect from the Revenue Authorities (**Annexure VIII**). Their Scheduled Castes/ Scheduled Tribes claim will be subjected to verification and clearance by the Screening Committee constituted by the Government vide G.O. (MS) No. 23/89/SCSTDD dated, 22-05-1989. The application of such candidates for the reserved seats of Scheduled Castes/Scheduled Tribes which do not contain Certificate from the Tahsildar concerned in the prescribed form provided in the body of the application will not be considered on any account (vide. G.O. (MS) No.31/90/SCSTDD dated 25-05-1990). The Community Certificate should clearly specify that the candidate himself/herself (not the father/mother) belongs to the Scheduled Castes/Scheduled Tribes. There is no separate reservation quota for the children born of Inter caste married Couples of whom one is a Scheduled Caste/Scheduled Tribes.

**WARNING**

Those who produce false certificates for claiming reservation under Scheduled Castes/Scheduled Tribes quota shall be liable for the penalties stipulated in Section 15 of the Act referred to in the Clause 8.2.1.(c). Candidates and their guardians who make such applications are warned that in addition to prosecution they will have to suffer the following consequences if the Scheduled Castes/ Scheduled Tribes certificate produced is found to be false and the candidate does not belong to any Scheduled Castes/Scheduled Tribes Communities under Section 16 of the Act:

“16- Benefits secured on the basis of false community certificates to be withdrawn”

1. Whoever not being a person belonging to any of the Scheduled Tribes secured admission in any education institutions against a seat reserved for such castes or tribes or secures any appointment in the Government, Government undertakings, Local Authority or in any other Company or Corporation owned or controlled by the Government or in any aided institutions against a post reserved for such castes or tribes or enjoys any other benefits intended exclusively for such castes or tribes by producing a false Community Certificate shall, on cancellation of the false Community Certificate, be removed by cancelling the irregular admission in the concerned educational institutions, or as the case may be removed from the said service forthwith and any benefit enjoyed by him as aforesaid shall be withdrawn forthwith.

2. Any amount paid to such person by Government or any other agency by way of scholarship, grant, allowance, stipend or any other financial benefit shall be recovered as if it is an arrear of public revenue due as land.

3. Any Degree, Diploma or any other educational qualifications acquired by such person after securing admission in any educational institution on the basis of a false community certificate shall also stand cancelled on cancellation of the community certificate obtained by him.

**8.3 Claim for reservation under socially and economically backward classes (SEBC)**

Leaving the seats set apart for persons with disabilities, Vide G.O. (Ms)No.195/2021/H&FWD dated 30.10.2021, 27 % of the remaining seats under State quota shall be reserved for candidates belonging to socially and Educationally Backward Classes. The percentage breakup of seats as per the SEBC reservation is as follows (Vide Letter No.S3/325/2021-Health, dated 12/11/2021).

(1). Ezhava (EZ)	- 8 %
(2). Muslim (MU)	- 7 %
(3). Other Backward Hindu (BH)	- 7 %
(4). Latin Catholic & Anglo Indians(LA)	- 3 %
(5). Other Backward Christian (BX)	- 1 %
(6). Kudumbi (KU)	- 1 %

- (i) The List of SEBC Communities - see **Annexure IX**
- (ii) Reservation to the socially and Educationally Backward Classes will be in accordance with the provisions in G.O. (P) 208/66/Edn. Dated 02.05.1966, G.O (MS) No95/08/SCSTDD dtd 6/10/2008, G.O. (Rt) No.3742/09/H&FWD dated 24.12.2009 and G.O (P) No.1/2015/BCDD dtd 1/1/2015 and G.O (MS)No.05/2020/BCDD, dated16.03.2020 and also as per Letter No.S3/325/2021-Health, dated 12/11/2021 and as amended from time to time.
- (iii) Candidates belonging to socially and Educationally Backward Classes as per G.O. (P) 208/66/Edn. Dated 02.05.1966 and G.O(P) No.1/2015/BCDD dt 1/1/2015 Should upload to the online application a certificate to the extent that the candidates belongs to the community which is designated as a Socially and Educationally Backward Class and does not belong to the category of Creamy

layer, in the Proforma given as **Annexure XIII** of the prospectus. Only the claims of the candidates of those communities that are included in the SEBC list as **Annexure IX** will be considered. Claims by candidates belonging to other communities, which are not included in the list, will be rejected even if certificates from the concerned Revenue Officers have been obtained and uploaded to the online application.

- (iv) Candidates claiming reservation under SEBC Quota should invariably upload Non-Creamy layer Certificate for the State Government Education purpose obtained from the Village Officer concerned (Annexure XIII). The above certificate should be obtained in the prescribed format available along with the online application form.
- (v) The candidature/allotment/admission of the candidates who furnish fake Non-Creamy layer certificate is liable to be cancelled. Such candidates are also liable to be debarred from appearing for the allotment/admission process for a period extending up to two years.
- (vi) Applicants claiming reservation under 'Latin Catholic' quota should produce a **Non-Creamy layer certificate** from the concerned Village Officer specifying that they belong to **Latin Catholic Community**. The certificate obtained from the Village Officer in support of the community claim cannot be subjected to any change at any subsequent stage.

***Reservation under SEBC for children of inter-caste married couples:*** Children of Inter caste married couple with either the father or mother or both belonging to a community included in SEBC list, are eligible for reservation under SEBC. Such candidates should furnish a Non-Creamy layer certificate specifying the community of the candidate from the Village Officer in the Proforma available. Candidates with father and mother belonging to different communities, both of which are included in the SEBC list, can avail communal reservation under any one of the communities of their parents, **to be mentioned by the candidate** in the relevant column of the online application. (For example a candidate born out of inter-caste marriage between an Ezhava and a Muslim can claim the reservation benefit applicable either to Ezhava or Muslim only and not against both). **The claim made in the online Application will be final and cannot be changed subsequently.**

(vii) Candidates who are children of Inter-Caste married couple of whom one is SC/ST, will be eligible for educational and monetary benefits admissible to SC/ST as per Para 2 (ii) of GO (Ms) No.25/2005/SCSTDD dated 20.6.2005, and if eligible for reservation under SEBC, will be granted the same, based on the Non-Creamy layer certificate in Annexure XIII and the inter-caste marriage certificate in Annexure VIII of the prospectus issued by Village Officer and to be obtained.

(viii) The reservation benefits under SEBC are given to the castes and communities listed in Annexure IX. **Any candidate whose community is not included in any of the categories belonging to SEBC list will not be considered for reservation benefits. He/She will not be eligible for relaxation of qualifying marks also.**

(ix) Those candidates claiming reservation under SEBC Quota the certificates in proof of the same shall be submitted along with the printout of the application. Late submissions will not be accepted.

(x) The seats un-availed by the SEBC category candidates will be transferred to General Merit.

## 9 HOW TO APPLY

**9.1** A candidate qualified either in **GPAT 2024 or GPAT 2025 or 2026 seeking** admission to the courses should apply online through the website **www.cee.kerala.gov.in** of the Commissioner for Entrance Examinations.

### Application fee

General / SEBC candidates (including service category)	:	Rs. 650/-
SC/ST candidates	:	Rs. 325/-

### **9.2 Step wise procedure for applying online:**

There are 5 steps for the online submission of application and all the steps are mandatory. Candidates should complete all steps and the **candidates are advised to keep the printout of the application acknowledgement page for future reference.** For the online submission of application, candidate has to visit the website [www.cee.kerala.gov.in](http://www.cee.kerala.gov.in) where he / she can find the link "**M. Pharm 2026 - Online Application**".

#### **9.2.1. Step 1: Registration**

This is a one-time process. Candidate should provide **GPAT-2024/2025/2026** testing ID and Date of birth for entering the registration page. Date of birth must be same as that of **GPAT-2024/2025/2026** registration page. Candidates will be prompted to enter mobile number and create a password and as outcome of the registration process, a system generated unique Application Number will be displayed which the candidate has to note down and use for the rest of the application submission process as well as the allotment process. Candidates are advised to create a strong, unique password. The requirements of a strong password are:

- a minimum length of 8 characters
- a minimum of one alphabet character [a-z or A-Z]
- a minimum of one number (0-9)
- a minimum of one symbol [! @ # \$ % ^ & \* ]

The candidate has to re-enter the password for confirmation.

Don't use a shared password or disclose the password to others. Be informed that the application number and password will be required through the remaining stages until the end of the admission process for accessing all the online facilities related to **M. Pharm 2026**

### 9.2.2. Step 2: Fill Application

All the basic information required for processing your application are to be filled in at this stage. Before filling the details, please read the Prospectus carefully.

The data provided here will be used for processing the application. Any mistake in filling this page or providing false/incomplete/wrong information will affect the candidate's eligibility for admission or claim for reservation under any category. It is obligatory that the candidate should fill all the mandatory items in the application.

- Candidates should take utmost care while filling the Online Application.
- Applicant should ensure that the data provided are correct before proceeding to the next step.

#### **Final Submission of Application**

If the application is filled completely, candidate can preview the details of the application before going to the next step by clicking the 'Save & Preview' button. After confirming that all the information given is correct and true, click '**Save & Finalize**' button to complete the application filling process.

**Note: - No modification will be possible after the Final submission.**

### 9.2.3. Step 3: Pay Application Fee

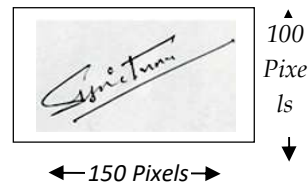
#### **Online Payment:**

The Application fee should be paid through online payment. Those having an Internet banking account, Credit card or Debit card can make use of this feature. Candidates availing this facility should read and follow each of the instructions given in the website carefully in order to ensure that the payment is successful. On successful payment, the candidate will be guided back to the home page wherein he/she will find the 'Pay Application Fee' tab at the top turned green and the candidate can proceed (next step) to uploading of photograph, signature and supporting documents. If the payment transaction was unsuccessful, a message to that effect will be displayed on the screen and the candidate can navigate to the homepage. On the other hand, if the candidate fails to receive the final confirmation (success or failure) message and is uncertain about the outcome of the transaction, due to communication failure or otherwise, he/she can re-login to the home page and inspect the 'Pay Application Fee' tab at the top to see if it's green or not. If it has not turned green, the payment has not succeeded and the candidate may try for online payment afresh or resort to the e-Challan payment mode. If the candidate's account is debited for an unsuccessful transaction, the amount will be reverted to his/her account within 10 - 12 working days.

#### 9.2.4. Step 4: Upload Signature and certificates:

##### Upload Signature of Candidate

- On a plain white sheet, the candidate should put his/her signature with black/blue ink. Scanned image of Signature must be clear.
- Scan this signature and crop around the signature. Do not scan the full sheet. Scanned image file should be in **jpg format**. (Jpeg)
- Dimensions of the image of signature must be **150 pixels width** and **100 pixels height**.
- File size should be between **10KB** and **30 KB**.



##### Upload Documents/Certificates

- The scanned images should be of the **original** documents/certificates and should be **clear** enough to read.
- The uploaded document should be in **PDF format**.
- The file size must **not exceed 500 KB**.

##### Read before uploading Documents/Certificates

- The Originals of the uploaded documents should be furnished before the admitting authority as and when required.
- The uploaded documents will be verified with the original documents by the admitting authority and the documents will be accepted only after this verification.
- It is the responsibility of the candidate to ensure the correctness and clarity of the documents uploaded.
- Uploading of any false or bogus documents may lead to disqualification of the candidacy.

##### Certificates/Documents to be uploaded

Each of the required Certificates must be scanned into a **PDF** file and **uploaded**. The scans should be of the original documents and in colour.

- 1. Nativity Proof:** Uploading Nativity proof is mandatory for all candidates. For details of Nativity condition and the documents to be uploaded see Clause 3.1 of the Prospectus.
- 2. Community or Non-Creamy Layer Certificate:** It is applicable only for those candidates who wish to avail any communal reservation and/or fee concession. Such candidates should upload Non-Creamy Layer Certificate (for SEBC/OEC) or Community Certificate (SC/ST). See Clause 8.2 and 8.3 of the prospectus for community reservation details.
  - i. SC/ST candidates:** Original Community Certificate obtained from Revenue officer not below the rank of Tahsildar.
  - ii. SEBC/OEC candidates :** Non-Creamy Layer Certificate in the prescribed format in original for state from the concerned Village Officer for community reservation/fee concession claims in the case of SEBC/OEC candidates

- iii. Original Non Creamy layer Certificate obtained from the Village Officer concerned in the Proforma available.
  - iv. **Candidates belonging to the communities listed in Annexure XI:** Original Community (Annexure XII) and Income Certificates (Annual family income is up to Rs. 6 lakh) from the village officer available in the prescribed format.
- 3. Income Certificate:** Candidates belonging to the communities listed in Annexure XI, whose family income is up to Rs. 6 lakh are eligible for educational concession. For claiming this, upload Income Certificate obtained from the Village Officer.
- 4. Inter-Caste Marriage Certificate:** Those candidates, who wish to avail inter-caste benefit as mentioned in the Clause 8.2.1 (e) of the Prospectus, need to upload the same in PDF format.

Candidates who are children of Inter-Caste married couple of whom one is SC/ST, will be eligible for educational and monetary benefits admissible to SC/ST as per Para 2 (ii) of GO (MS) No.25/2005/SCSTDD dated 20.06.2005, based on the **Inter-Caste marriage Certificate** issued by Tahsildar to be uploaded.

Candidates who are the children of Inter- Caste married couple with either the father or mother belonging to a community included in SEBC list: **Non-Creamy Layer certificate** specifying the community of the candidate from the Village Officer\_in the Proforma to be uploaded.

- 5. Certificate for claiming Persons with Disabilities (PD):** For claiming PwD reservation as per Clause 7.1.3, Certificate of disability obtained from the District Medical Board is required to be uploaded.
- 6. Document to prove age (for Service Candidates only):** Relevant page of the Secondary School Leaving Certificate/Indian Passport /Birth certificate.
- 7. Service Declaration (Annexure XIV and XV)**

*Remember: The Original of the uploaded documents should be furnished before the admission authority as and when required.*

#### 9.2.5. Step 5: Print Application Acknowledgement Page

After completing uploading of all the necessary certificate/documents, take a printout of the Application Acknowledgement Page of the application and the uploaded documents by clicking on the link '**Print Application Acknowledgement Page**'. Candidates are advised to keep the printout of the application for future reference. **No need to send the printout of the Application Acknowledgement Page or any supporting documents to the office of the CEE.**

**For In-Service Candidates:** - The print out of the Application Acknowledgement Page (including printout of uploaded documents) along with the following documents should be forwarded to the Head of the concerned Department.

1. Declaration (in original) to the effect that she/he has not undergone **M.Pharm** Course under Service Quota.
2. Details of service from the Head of the Department (for Non Gazetted) and from Accountant General (for Gazetted employees).

**DO NOT SEND THE PRINTOUT OF APPLICATION ACKNOWLEDGEMENT PAGE TO THE OFFICE OF THE CEE**

### **9.3 Documents to be furnished at the time of admission before the Admitting authority.**

Candidates should produce all the Original Documents at the time of admission.

- First page of the printout of the Application Acknowledgement Page.
- Proof for Date of Birth: Secondary School Leaving Certificate/Birth certificate/ Indian Passport.
- B.Pharm Degree/Pass Certificate.
- Score card of GPAT-2024/2025/2026
- Transfer Certificate (TC) and Conduct Certificate from the Institution last attended.
- Originals of all the Uploaded documents/certificates

#### **Additional documents in original to be presented by the Service Candidates:**

- Declaration to the effect that he/she has not undergone **M.Pharm** Course under Service Quota (Annexure XIV and XV)
- Details of service from the Head of the Department (for Non Gazetted) and from Accountant General (for Gazetted employees).

**Service Quota Candidates should send the printout of the Application Acknowledgement Page, along with all the required documents, by Registered Post/Speed Post/Hand Delivery to the Controlling Officer concerned (Director of Medical Education/Director of Health Services/Director of Insurance Medical Services), before the time and date notified by the Commissioner for Entrance Examinations.**

### **10 PRODUCTION OF ORIGINAL CERTIFICATES**

All certificates in original are to be produced at the time of Admission. In case of any doubt about any certificate furnished by the candidates, such certificate will be accepted only if found correct on further verification. The Allotment given will be cancelled if it is found later that false certificates have been produced or that the admission has been secured by fraudulent means.

### **11 PREPARATION OF RANK LIST**

- 11.1 The Rank list will be prepared on the basis of the GAPT Score obtained by the candidates in GRADUATE PHARMACY APTITUDE TEST (GPAT) 2024/2025/2026 conducted by National Board of Examinations in Medical sciences (NBEMS), New Delhi . The category wise cut off qualifying marks, fixed for each category for the GPAT 2024/2025/2026 will be considered as the category wise cut off qualifying marks for the respective category for the year 2026. **In case of a tie in GPAT score, the candidate (including Service Quota) with the higher marks for B Pharm (4<sup>th</sup> year marks / 7 & 8 semesters' marks) will be placed higher. If the tie still persists, the candidate greater in age will be placed higher.**
- 11.2 The service candidates should apply as stipulated in clause 9.2.5 of this Prospectus. The controlling officer/head of department (DME/DHS/DIMS/Drugs

Controller) concerned will verify the application and documents and forward it to Commissioner for Entrance Examinations, Kerala for further action. Service quota for Post Graduate Course can be claimed only once during the period of whole service.

## **12 CENTRALISED ALLOTMENT PROCESS**

### **12.1 AN OVERVIEW**

The Centralized Allotment Process for all Seats in Government Colleges and Govt. Seats in Self Financing Colleges for which the allotment is made by the Commissioner for Entrance Examinations, Kerala through a Single Window System (SWS). The allotments will be strictly based on the options exercised by the candidate, the rank list prepared for the Commissioner for Entrance Examinations based on the GPAT score of 2024/2025/2026 and eligible reservation(s) of the candidate and availability of seats.

*Candidates are advised to visit the website [www.cee.kerala.gov.in](http://www.cee.kerala.gov.in) and keep a constant watch on the leading print and electronic media, pertaining to notifications/instructions regarding allotment.*

### **12.2 Registering Options**

- I. **Option Registration Fee:** - A fee to be prescribed by the Commissioner for Entrance Examinations shall be paid by the candidates at the time of Option Registration. The registration fee once paid will not be allowed to change at any instance. The registration fee can be paid online to the CEE before registering options.
- II. **Refund conditions for option registration fee:**
  - a. Refund of option registration fee for the eligible candidates will be made only after the completion of allotment process and it will be notified
  - b. The registration fee of those candidates who do not get allotment will be refunded.
  - c. If a candidate gets **allotment in the second phase** and does not join within the stipulated time, the option registration fee will be considered as penalty and will not be refunded.
  - d. Option registration fee of the candidates who quit the seats after taking admission **in the second phase** will be considered as penalty and will not be refunded
  - e. Option registration fee will not be adjusted to the course fee and it will be refunded to eligible admitted candidates.

f. Conditions, if any, regarding penalty will be notified later.

12.2.1 The Registration of College/Course Options can be done only after publication of the Rank list. It need not be registered at the time of submission of Application or at the time of submission of Academic details. The time schedule for registering options will be notified separately. The details of colleges and courses will be made available in the website at the time of registration of options.

12.2.2 Candidates can access the website [www.cee.kerala.gov.in](http://www.cee.kerala.gov.in) and follow the instructions given therein to register their options.

The steps involved in registering options are summarized below:

- Accessing the website**
- Logging on the candidate's Home page**
- Registering of options using the course and college codes**
- Saving the Options registered.**
- Viewing the list of options registered.**
- Logging off from the Home page.**

Applications of candidates who do not comply Stage I and Stage II of Submission of Application by vide Clause 9 and who do not give their options online within the time schedule will not be considered for allotment. Options submitted by Fax, e-mail, post, courier, hand delivery etc will not be considered for allotment.

12.2.3 Any candidate, who wishes to register his/her options, should have the 'Application number 'Registration ID' and the 'Password' which he/she has created, readily available with him/her.

12.2.4 All options available to a candidate, based on the courses he/she has applied for, can be registered through a single registration. Options to all eligible courses/colleges will have to be registered as per his/her relative order of preference in different streams taken together using the numbers 1, 2, 3 etc. The most preferred option among all options available in the various streams may be registered using the number 1; the next preferred using the number 2 and so on. A candidate can register all the available options if he/she desires so. However, it is not compulsory that he/she should exercise all the options. Candidate will be considered only against the options registered by him/her.

12.2.5 **How to register options in his/her Home Page:** By clicking on the 'Option Registration' tab, the Course - College - Fee combination list will be displayed in the Home Page. Here all the eligible options of the candidate will be displayed and the candidate should select only those options in which he/she is interested. The candidate is expected to select the options in his/her order of preference. All options registered by the candidate will be processed. If a candidate gets allotted to a particular seat, based on his/her option, he/she is bound to accept it, failing which; he/she will lose that allotment as well as all the existing options. The option once lost will not be available in the subsequent phases.

#### 12.2.6 Online option Confirmation for participating in subsequent phases of allotment:

Candidates who are having valid options and are willing to participate in the second allotment/subsequent allotment have to log in to his/her Option Registration Page and Confirm their options by clicking the 'Confirm' button available in his/her Option Registration Page. Candidates can delete their unwanted options or alter the priority of existing options only after the online option confirmation.

12.2.7 **Necessity of saving the selected options:** For saving the work, the Save menu item is to be clicked. It's important to save the work frequently. The last saved data only will be available in subsequent sessions. All unsaved data will be lost on exit, by logging out or other means. So, please make sure that the selected course-college-quota combinations are saved before exit. CEE will not be responsible for the loss of unsaved data due to not saving the data before exit.

12.2.8 **Doesn't press refresh or back button:** Don't refresh the page by any means other than by clicking the given buttons or tabs. Also, no attempt should be made to open the option registration page in multiple tabs or windows. If for any reason you exit the system by logging out or otherwise, you can start all over again from the home page after logging in.

12.2.9 **Printing of the Option List based on the options registered:** After saving the selected options (after necessary additions, deletions and re-arrangements), a printout of the final list of selected course-college combinations may be taken and kept as a record for your own reference.

Once the candidate is satisfied with the options registered, he/she should 'Log off' the system by clicking on "logout" link. Don't exit the system without logging out. The process of 'Registration of Options' is complete when the candidate logs off. This action is compulsory for preventing the misuse of his/her Home Page by others.

**12.3. Candidates** may collect the full details of colleges such as location, accessibility, facilities available, fee to be remitted etc. before filing options. The detailed addresses and telephone numbers of the colleges will be provided in the website while registering the options online.

#### 12.4 Processing of Options and Allotment:

**1. Allotment Schedule and Allotment Memo:** After the period earmarked for registering options, the options will be processed and the allotment for all courses will be published on the website, [www.cee.kerala.gov.in](http://www.cee.kerala.gov.in), on the date notified by the CEE. The allotment memo, the printout of which can be taken from the website, will show the course and college to which the candidate is allotted and the fee to be remitted for the course allotted. The schedule of allotment will be notified separately.

#### **2. Remittance of Fee:**

The prescribed tuition fee for the Course will have to be remitted by the candidate

at the college where he/she is allotted by CEE. Those candidates who do not remit the fee on or before the date prescribed for the same will lose their allotment as well as the eligibility for further online allotments. The second allotment will be published on the date specified. Candidates who have not received any allotment in the first allotment and who have received an allotment in the second allotment will have to remit the prescribed fee for the course allotted. If a candidate has a different allotment than the one received in the first allotment, the fee for which is higher than that remitted as per the first allotment, he/she will have to remit the difference in fee. The amount to be remitted in this manner will be shown in the Allotment memo of the candidate. The same process will be repeated in the subsequent allotments. Service candidates are also required to remit the tuition fees. Fee remitted by service quota candidates will not be refunded/reimbursed under any circumstances.

### **12.5 Admission for all courses:**

Candidates allotted to courses, and who remit the fee as prescribed, should take admission in the college allotted as per the schedule prescribed by the CEE. Candidates who do not take admission will lose their allotment as well as the claims for further allotments. No extension of time for reporting to the college will be granted under any circumstances. The candidates are liable to pay admission fee as prescribed by the University concerned at the time of admission.

### **12.6 Online Option Confirmation**

Candidates who are having valid options and who are willing to participate in the second allotment/subsequent allotments have to log in to his/her Home page and confirm their options by clicking the '**Confirm**' button available in his /her Home page. Candidates can delete their unwanted options or alter their priority for existing options only after the online option confirmation. If a candidate who does not confirm the higher order options by clicking the 'Confirm' button available in his /her Home page, his/her higher order options will not be available in subsequent phases.

- (A) After each allotment, the options below the 'allotted one' of the candidate will automatically be removed from the option list of the candidate. For example, if a candidate had registered 10 options in all, and if he/she is allotted his/her 5<sup>th</sup> option, all options from 6 to 10 will be removed from the option list. Since the 5<sup>th</sup> option is the allotted one, it will not be seen in the option list. Options from 1 to 4 only will remain valid and will be considered for future allotments.
- (B) If a candidate is satisfied with an allotment and does not want to be considered against his/her remaining options, he/she will have the facility to cancel all the remaining options. He/she may also cancel specific options among the remaining options as per his/her desire. The candidate will also have the facility to alter the priority of the remaining options. But the candidate will not be permitted to register any fresh options to the existing ones.
- (C) The facility for confirmation and cancellation/deletion/alteration will be available for a specified period of time as notified, after which the facility will be withdrawn. A candidate retaining all or any of the options after each allotment is bound to accept

the next allotment, if any, given to him/her. If the candidate fails to accept the allotment, he/she will lose all the allotments/admission and will not be considered for any further allotments to any course or college.

- (D) Forfeiture of the claims in CAP: The claims in Centralized Allotment Process conducted by the CEE will be cancelled under the following reasons.
- (i) Nonpayment of tuition fee as specified in the allotment memo.
  - (ii) Non joining of the course/college within the stipulated time as specified by the CEE.
  - (iii) Discontinued with TC to join courses other than the courses allotted by the CEE or for any other reason.
- (E) Last Rank Details: The last rank details of the allotment will be published after each allotment and will be made available on the website. The last rank given will be the rank of the candidate and not the position in the category list.

## 12.7 Claims for fee concession

12.7.1 **Claim for fee concession to SC/ST and OEC Candidates:** Candidates belonging to Scheduled Caste/Scheduled Tribe communities allotted against merit seats or against the seats reserved for them are exempted from payment of fees. Candidates belonging to Other Eligible Communities (OEC) admitted against merit seats or against Government seats through SEBC reservation are also exempted from payment of fees. [G.O (P) No. 50/2009/SCSTDD dated 02/07/2009.] They should furnish Non-Creamy layer certificate obtained from the Village officer concerned in the prescribed format along with the printout of the application as per GO(P) No.1/2015/BCDD dated 1/01/2015. The List of OEC Communities is given in **Annexure X.**

12.7.2 **Claim for fee concession to candidates belonging to communities in Annexure XI:** Candidates belonging to the communities listed in **Annexure -XI**, whose family income is up to Rs.6 lakh are eligible for educational concession as per GO(Rt) No.2319/15/H&FWD dated 21/07/2015. They should provide community and income certificates (financial year 2025-2026) from the village officer in the prescribed format.

**Note: *Income from salary:*** In the case of candidates whose parents are employed, the Basic Pay and Dearness Allowance of the employee(s) are to be taken into account for the purpose of calculating total annual family income. Inclusion of Interim relief in the annual income will be as per the orders of Revenue Department. HRA, Special pay, Deputation pay, TA, PTA, honorarium etc. need not be counted for calculating the annual family income.

12.7.3 **Claim for fee concession to the children of Fisherman:** Candidates who are the children of Registered Fishermen allotted against merit seats or against the seats reserved for them are exempted from payment of fees to Professional PG Degree Courses as per GO (MS)No.47/14/FPD, Dated 09.06.2014 if they upload a certificate from Fisheries Officer concerned of Kerala Fishermen Welfare Fund Board along with the online application.

- 12.7.4 Claim for fee concession to the inmates of Sri Chitra Home, Nirbhaya Home, Juvenile Home: Candidates who are inmates of Sri Chitra Home, Nirbhaya Home, Govt. Juvenile Justice Homes and other institutions run by Government allotted against Merit seats are exempted from payment of fees to Professional PG Degree Courses as per GO (Ms) No. 43/2018/HEDN, dated: 02.02.2018. A certificate in this regard from the Director, Dept. of Women & Child Development is to be produced for availing the fee concession.
- 12.7.5 The SC/ST Development Department will take steps to reimburse the fees to the Students admitted under SC/ST quota for M.Pharm Course.
- 12.7.6 SC/ST/OEC candidates, who get allotment, in Govt. seats shall remit a token amount of Rs.100/- (as part of Caution Deposit) by cash.
- 12.7.7 Those candidates who fail to remit the fee on or before the date specified will lose their current allotment as well as the eligibility for further allotments except for Mop-Up Counseling, if any conducted.
- 12.7.8 If a candidate is satisfied with an allotment and does not want to be considered for further allotment(s), he/she must delete all the remaining higher options. A candidate retaining all or any of his/her higher options after an allotment are bound to accept the new allotment, if any granted. In such cases, he/she will not be permitted to retain the earlier allotment if any under any circumstances.
- 12.8 SECOND/FURTHER ALLOTMENT AND REMITTANCE OF FEE:** The second/further allotment list will be published on the date to be notified. If a candidate has a different allotment than the one accepted in the previous allotment, the fee for which is higher than that remitted as per the previous allotment, he/she will have to remit the difference in fee through the same method as prescribed in clause 12.6 The amount to be remitted in this manner will be shown in the Allotment Memo of the candidate. If the Fee/Difference in fee is not remitted he/she will lose the new allotment.
- 12.9 The Commissioner for Entrance Examinations is authorized to prepare and publish detailed guidelines and conditions for centralized counseling and the subsequent stray vacancy filling phases, if any. During further counseling and stray vacancy filling phases there may be strict constraints on the kinds of moves from one course to another course or from one college to another college. Candidates who are included in the Rank List /Category wise Lists of M.Pharm course published by the Commissioner for Entrance Examinations (CEE) shall register fresh options for stray vacancy allotment through the official website as per directions of the CEE.

### **13 POST ALLOTMENT ACTIVITIES:**

- 13.1 **Reporting at the College:** Candidates need to report for admission before the Principal/Head of the institution concerned only when the announcement regarding the same is made by the Director of Medical Education. He/she should report with the originals of the following documents ( i to xii):
- (i) Allotment Memo received online.
  - (ii) Fee mentioned in the allotment memo

- (iii) Certificate to prove date of birth.
- (iv) Transfer Certificate (TC) and Conduct Certificate from the Institution last attended.
- (v) Mark lists of all parts of B.Pharm Degree examination and Degree/Provisional Certificate (if applicable).
- (vi) Mark lists of 2nd, 3rd and 4th year of B Pharm course and Diploma in Pharmacy Certificate in the case of Lateral Entry candidates.
- (vii) Copies of the GPAT 2024/2025/2026 qualified score card.
- (viii) Eligibility Certificate from KUHS, in the case of candidates who have passed the qualifying examination from universities outside Kerala and other universities within Kerala.
- (ix) Migration Certificate, if applicable.
- (x) Undertaking as per Clause 21
- (xi) Pharmacist Registration Certificate issued by the State Pharmacy Council.
- (xii) Medical Certificate of Physical Fitness.

**13.2** Fees other than the one already paid vide clause 12.6 as applicable to the course/institution, will have to be remitted by the candidate at the time of taking admission in the college.

The candidate is specifically instructed not to share his/her Security Key, Password and Registration No. to the authorities of institutions concerned at the time of joining.

**13.3 Verification of Documents:** The Principal/Head of the College or Institution shall be personally responsible for verification of original documents and satisfaction of the correctness of the records produced by the candidate at the time of seeking admission in the college/institution. The University concerned shall also verify the records produced by the candidates who got admission in the college/institution by deputing special teams and submit a report to Government within 10 days from the last date fixed for closing of admissions.

**13.4 Failure to report for Admission:** Candidates who do not take admission on the prescribed date in the allotted college will lose their admission. Those candidates, who fail to take admission in Govt. seats after being allotted to the Govt. seats in the last allotment, resulting in the non filling of such seats, will be proceeded against by the Govt. as per rules.

## **14. SEAT ALLOTMENT PROTOCOL**

### **14.1 Admission and Allotment in Government Colleges:**

#### **14.1.1. Allotment in Government Colleges to Candidates with multiple Claims under Mandatory Quota:**

All candidates included in the Rank Lists are eligible for allotment under State Merit (SM). Candidates might be entitled for other reservation quotas also under Mandatory Reservation. For example, a candidate may have the benefit of SEBC reservation (EZ/MU/BH/LC/BX/KU) or Scheduled Caste (SC) or Scheduled Tribe (ST) claim. The seats will be offered on the hierarchy of quotas. The hierarchy in order is as follows:

(i) State Merit (SM) - All candidates included in the Rank Lists are eligible for allotment under State Merit.

(ii) Communal Reservation (SEBC/SC/ST)

A candidate without SEBC/SC/ST reservation benefit will be considered only against the 'State Merit' seats wherever available at the time of allotment. Such candidates will be allotted a seat as per the availability of seats.

**14.2 Seat allotment protocol in self financing colleges:**

Allotment of seats in private self financing colleges will be college/institution wise.

**15. Dates of allotment**

The schedule of allotment dates will be as per notification of CEE/Govt.

**16. FEE**

16.1 The fee structure applicable for Government Pharmacy Colleges is given below:-

16.2 The fee structure for the Postgraduate Pharmacy Course (M.Pharm.) in Self-Financing Colleges for admission to the 2026 batch shall be in accordance with the fee fixed by the AFRC for the respective institution.

16.3 Candidates belonging to SC/ST communities allotted against merit seats or against the seats reserved for them are exempted from payment of fee.

16.4 SC/ST candidates will have to pay the 'Caution Deposit' as per rules.

16.5 Candidates who are children of Inter-Caste married couple of which one is SC/ST, will be eligible for educational and monetary benefits admissible to SC/ST as per GO (MS) No.25/2005/SCSTDD dated 20.6.2005 if they have submitted the 'Inter-Caste Marriage Certificate' issued by Revenue officials (Refer clause 8.2.1(e) along with the application and if the claim has been accepted.

16.6 If a candidate moves over from one specialty to another specialty of his/her option from the same rank list in the same college or a different college, all the fees remitted shall be adjusted with the concurrence of Director of Medical Education/ Commissioner of Entrance Examinations for the new course.

## **17 TRANSFER OF FEE TO COLLEGES/REFUND OF COURSE FEE/LIQUIDATED DAMAGES**

- 17.1 No refund of fee will be made to candidates who apply for Transfer Certificate/Cancellation of admission under any circumstances, after the last date for taking admission by candidate's consequent **to the third round of allotment**. They will have to pay Liquidated damages as stipulated in clause 17.3.
- 17.2 A candidate who has remitted **option registration fee** but does not take admission in the college consequent to the **second round** of allotment will not be eligible for refund of fee.
- 17.3 Levying amount towards liquidated damages from candidates discontinuing their Studies. **Every candidate including service candidates admitted to the course shall execute a bond on Rs.200/- Kerala Stamp Paper (Annexure XVIII) at the time of admission to the course** that he/she shall pay to Government stipend drawn/received if any if any during the period of study in addition to a sum of Rs. 2,00,000/- (Rupees Two Lakh only) as liquidated damages in the event of his/her interrupting or discontinuing the course at any time after closing date of admission to Post Graduate Pharmacy courses in academic year 2026.

## **18 CHANGES IN DATE OF CENTRALISED ALLOTMENT**

The Commissioner for Entrance Examinations, Kerala will not entertain any request for change of any date fixed in the Centralized Allotment Process/Admission from time to time.

## **19 DISPUTES**

All disputes pertaining to the allotment for admission shall fall within the jurisdiction of the Hon'ble High Court of Kerala.

## **20 CHANGE OF COLLEGE OR COURSE**

The candidates will not be allowed to have transfer from one college to another or one course to another (even if it is in the same college), after the closing of allotment/admission process for the year 2026.

## **21 PREVENTIVE MEASURES AGAINST RAGGING:**

According to the Kerala Prohibition of Ragging Act, 1998, 'ragging' means doing of any act by disorderly conduct to a student of an educational institution, which causes or is likely to cause physical or psychological harm or raising apprehension or shame or embarrassment to that student and includes teasing or abusing or playing practical jokes or causing hurt to such students or asking a student to do any act or to perform something which such student will not in the ordinary course be willing to do.

All institutions will have to abide by the directives of the Honorable Supreme Court of India, Dated May 16, 2007 in SLP No. (S) 24295 of 2006 University of Kerala Vs Council, Principal's, Colleges, Kerala and Ors [with SLP (c) No.24296-99/2004 and W.P (Cr) No. 173/2006 and SLP (c) No.14356/2005] and the recommendations approved by the Honorable Supreme Court of India on effective prevention of ragging in educational institutions.

In case, the applicant for admission is found to have indulged in ragging in the past

or if it is noticed later that he/she has indulged in ragging, admission may be refused or he/she shall be expelled from the educational institution. It shall be the collective responsibility of the authority of the institution to see to it that effective steps for preventing ragging are taken. Anti-ragging committees and anti-ragging squads will have to be formed to take effective measures against ragging and they should adhere to the stipulations and effectively monitor and comply with the directives. Each of the student of the institution and his/her parents, or guardian are required to submit a combined undertaking at the time of registration/admission in prescribed format available in **Annexure XIX** which is mandatory for registration/admission.

## **22 POWERS TO MAKE ADDITIONS/MODIFICATIONS**

The Prospectus is subject to modification/addition as may be considered necessary by the Government and will be issued as Executive orders/ notification. Any other items not specifically covered in this prospectus will be decided by the Director of Medical Education and that decision shall be final.
